TO ALL WHO LOVE CHICO OAKS ADVENTIST SCHOOL AND PARADISE ADVENTIST ACADEMY

On March 6, 2019, the Chico and Paradise SDA churches met (in joint session) to discuss how to conduct their educational ministries for the 2019-2020 school year.

During that meeting, the following motions were passed:

"Motion 2: Move that, effective the 2019-2020 school year, COAS and PAA operate as a single school."

During that same meeting, the following motion was also passed:

"Motion 2A: Move that a mandatory review of Motion 2, conducted by the constituency of each church, be completed by December 31, 2019."

In order to comply with Motion 2A, and to gain (and provide) information needed to make good decisions for the future of our educational ministries, we have scheduled a series of meetings. (Some of the meetings have already occurred.) The grand finale of this series will be a meeting of the Chico and Paradise SDA churches (in joint session) on December 9, 2019 at 7:00 pm.

The dates of the meetings are as follows:

Oct. 10: PAC Board

During this meeting, the PAC Board will discuss (and possibly formalize a recommendation) on how to continue providing a Christian education ministry in the region. (Preliminary conversations indicate that this may involve an invitation to the CAC to enter into joint constituency with the PAC.)

Oct. 15: COAS/PAA School Board and COAS/PAA Parent Town Hall

We would like to extend a special invitation to all parents of COAS/PAA students to attend this meeting. We hope to hear parent concerns and preferences regarding the future of COAS/PAA. By the end of this meeting, we hope to have enough information to develop a meaningful Parent Survey. This survey may provide useful data to inform our decision-making process.

Oct. 24: PAC Business Meeting

During this meeting, the PAC will act on the recommendation developed by the PAC Board regarding how to continue providing a Christian education ministry in the region.

Nov. 6: CAC Business Meeting

During this meeting, more information will be gained and distributed as we prepare for the joint meeting in December.

Dec. 9: Joint session of the CAC and PAC.

With God's help, this will be a meeting filled with joy, hope, and good decisions. We invite you to make this to process a priority in prayer.

We continue to be grateful for the opportunity to work beside you as we strive to provide Christian education to the young people of our community.



Miracle on Wheels

Wagon trips, a staple in David Vixie's classroom for the past 25 years, nearly ended with the destruction of 18 horse pulled vehicles from the Camp Fire on November 8, 2018. After the fire, students from Mr. Vixie's classroom began asking if there would be another wagon trip in 2019. When they learned the price for wagons (they're expensive!), one student decided to launch a



GoFundMe campaign that raised \$4,000. Another student donated personal savings to the wagon fund. Even though this student would be in the academy by the time the next trip took place, the student felt "other students need to experience this life changing trip" also. These funds, together with some insurance money, bought two wagons. Before the fire, Mr. Vixie had communicated with a family in Idaho about the possibility of purchasing a

wagon—the price was too high. After the fire, Mr. Vixie contacted the family again—and they decided to donate the wagon. A few weeks after the school year began, our COAS/PAA eighth graders and sponsors took an epic journey across the Great Salt Lake Desert which included Hastings Pass made famous by the Donner Party tragedy. Mr. Vixie journaled and shared life lessons on this year's trip across the desert, Similar to a teacher who traveled with the Donner Party. Students and participating sponsors gained lasting real-life lessons for the post-fire journey of life that paralleled many of the events of the Donner Party who had also lost much. Little Red School House

Because PAC members are so generous with their Lamb's Offering for PAA worthy student assistance, the money cannot be contained in an offering plate. Joedy Melashenko is going to build us a new little red schoolhouse to receive these offerings. Delivery date: October 26.

School Vans

The Northern California Conference has donated \$80,000 to purchase two ten-passenger vans to bus our COAS/PAA students from Paradise to Chico and home again each day. A team of parents is being assembled to serve as drivers. Monday, Oct. 14 will be the first day of this new PAA Transportation system. Maranatha to Build 200 Sheds

Maranatha is partnering with PAC to build 200 storage sheds for fire survivors in Paradise between November 5 and November 25. This is one of the most ambitious outreach services to date in our efforts to rebuild the Paradise community. The church has donated \$20,000 to this project, the Northern California Conference \$50,000, and the North American Division \$50,000. So we are well underway of reaching our \$267,000 goal. Additional grant requests are being submitted to the North Valley Community Foundation, the Butte Strong Fund, and the Paradise Rotary Foundation. Kitchen Kits

Ever since the Camp Fire, the Paradise Adventist Church has been actively pursuing outreach opportunities to Camp Fire Survivors. Building and distributing Home Kits has been one of those outreach opportunities. So far, the Paradise Adventist Church has distributed close to 150 Home Kits, largely funded by grants. Kitchen kits include various household items such as pots, pans, plates, utensils, towels, cups, knives, spatulas, sponges, etc. With our last distribution we were also able to give out Cleaning Kits that included a bucket of cleaning supplies, generously donated from friends in the Southern California Conference.

NAD/ACS Site Visit

Recently, the Director of Disaster Response for Adventist Community Services at the North American Division of Seventh-Day Adventist, W. Derrick Lea



came to visit Paradise. He was joined by James Lim, Adventist Community Director for NCC. They were given a tour of the devastation, including Adventist Health: Feather River, Paradise Adventist Church campus, and the Paradise Adventist Academy. They were able to see firsthand the very real impact that this devastation has caused our community. Following the tour they met with our church leadership team to

discuss mistakes of the past, help that can be implemented now, future plans, and how the NAD can help support the rebuilding of the Adventist Community on the Ridge. One of the ways the NAD offered to help immediately is to provide funding to purchase a shower trailer that will allow the Maranatha team a reliable place to shower during their stay on the campus. It was a very honest, heartfelt meeting on both sides that will allow for greater communication by all parties.
