PAA Restoration Report

- 1. The air quality monitor has been removed from the PAA campus because air quality is no longer an issue of concern.
- 2. The K-4 building debris has been cleaned up, the soil has been tested, and we are ready for next steps.
- 3. Asbestos removal in the 5-8 building will be completed today. Plastic removal in the 5-8 building will be complete on Tuesday. The asbestos in the woodshop office has been removed. *All known asbestos on the PAA campus has been removed!*
- 4. The fire debris has been removed from the gym basement. The basement has also been power washed and is in the process of being sealed.
- 5. Damaged drop ceiling tiles have been removed and are slated for replacement.
- 6. Carpets have been ripped out and floors have been ground down to remove residual so that new carpets can be laid.
- The gym ceiling and roof will be replaced so that there will be no residual smoke damage.
- 8. The electrical panels will be shipped from Texas on November 7. We should have power by first week of December!
- 9. Subcontractors are visiting our campus and preparing bids as we move into the reconstruction of our campus phase.

Maranatha Camp Fire Shed Project

Next week Maranatha volunteers will begin three weeks of service in Paradise to build and place 200 sheds across our community.

Funding Received

- 1. \$20,000 from Paradise Adventist Church
- 2. \$50,000 from Northern California Conference
- 3. \$50,000 from North American Division
- 4. \$50,000 North Valley Community Foundation/Butte Strong Fund
- 5. \$50,000 from Aaron Rogers Fund
- 6. \$50,000 from Paradise Rotary Foundation
- 7. \$7,100 from Placerville Adventist Church

Total: \$277,100





Donations

- 1. Tent We thought we were going to have to buy one costing \$25,000 but In Tent Events is generously allowing us to use it for a nominal set up and delivery fee of \$1,300 for 2 Tents
- Joe Hoglund from Chico Building has received a donation from one of his suppliers of 3 truck loads of lumber and other vendors are giving us discounted rates

- 3. On Wednesday morning, Oct 16 Joelle Chinnock prayed that God would not only meet the needs of this project but leave us with an abundance. She prayed that we would have 7 Forklift offers, not just the 3 we need. Within 30 minutes she received an email from Capay Farms stating they would like to help with the project, pending owner approval. 45 minutes after that, Joelle got a call from the Paradise Hope Center stating they will be assisting us with delivering some of the sheds and allowing us to use their truck, trailer and forklift.
- 4. Please pray for God's providence as we talk with Capay Farms. They have all the resources and manpower to help deliver the sheds. We will be talking with the owners who fly in from San Francisco next week to see if they are willing to help with this project.
- 5. Brad Brown has generously donated the use of this rental house in Magalia to house 10-15 volunteers.

These are the following ways in which we still need help:

- Someone to be the Site Coordinator for shed placement. This person will
 need to have an understanding of town & county codes as far as set backs,
 building codes and easements to help locate the best spot for a shed on the
 recipients property.
- Volunteers to help the few days before Nov 5 as we set up and prepare for Maranatha's arrival.
