CREATION NUGGET

Genetic entropy is a term used to describe the process of increasing disorder in the human genome. In his

book Genetic Entropy and the Mystery of the Genome, Dr John C. Sanford, a Cornell University researcher, explains the relentless deterioration of the human genome through the process

of random mutation. The detrimental

effect of mutation on the germ cell level (estimated at 100-300 point mutations per person per generation), outweighs by far the neutralizing effect of natural selection. The scenario for mankind's

future is therefore bleak with an ever increasing and accumulating load of

destructive genes for each new generation.

The projected

/ end result will be extinction! This is very different to the

evolutionary scenario with its "from simple to complex" model. The facts show that biology goes the opposite way, a relentless degeneration. "In the beginning God said that [creation] was very good." Adam lived 930 years (Genesis 5:5). Genetic entropy has reduced the lifespan of man to only 1/10th since creation! May God have mercy on us.

The Paradise Adventist Church has recently gone solar! Preparations included re-roofing of the Adventist Community Services (Building A), the Youth Center, and the Lower Sabbath School Wing. Trees were removed from the sides of the ACS building and Fellowship Center to open space for more sunlight. The solar panels have been installed and are all hooked up.

As energy costs continue to soar, our new solar system will save us a lot of money through the years to come. It will immediately freeze our electrical

expenses, and once our loan is paid off, our electrical expenses will be minimal.

To meet the upfront costs of roofing projects and solar panel installation, PAC took out a loan with the Pacific



Union Conference Revolving Fund. This loan will be paid off over the next seven years with the money we would normally have spent in our monthly PG&E payments.
