Most of us spend so much of our time within four man-made walls. No wonder we forget how wonderful and amazing our God is. We forget His creativity, diversity, complexity, omnipotence, and so much that nature demonstrates. Take a walk outside and spend a little time marveling at God's handiwork. I was inspired by the Apostle John's experience described in this quote from the devotional book, *Conflict & Courage*, by Ellen G. White p. 362:

In his isolated home (on the Island of Patmos) John was able to study more closelv than ever before the manifestations of divine power as recorded in the book of nature and in the pages of inspiration.... In former years his eyes had been greeted by the sight of forest-covered hills, green valleys, and fruitful plains; and in the beauties of nature it had ever been his delight to trace the wisdom and skill of the Creator. He was now surrounded by scenes that to many would appear gloomy and uninteresting; but to John it was otherwise. While his surroundings might be desolate and barren, the blue heavens that bent above him were as bright and beautiful as the skies above his loved Jerusalem. In the wild, rugged rocks, in the mysteries of the deep, in the glories of the firmament, he read important lessons. All bore the message of God's power and glory....By the rocks he was reminded of Christ. the Rock of his strength, in whose shelter he could hide without fear. From the exiled apostle on rocky Patmos there went up the most ardent longing of soul after God, the most fervent prayers.

In the last three months Sabbath Walks & Company walked along the Oroville Diversion Pool and through a long train tunnel; skirted mud puddles and a large gully to discover a cave; and walked on the renowned Paradise Bike Trail. We enjoyed the fall colors and great company.

Alas, no Sabbath Walks have been planned for the coming year. Sabbath Walks & Company has conducted walks for over six years now — 76 Sabbath afternoon walks in 26 different locations! Hopefully we have helped you discover new and interesting places you can share with your family and friends. 
Voila! Instant Cheer!

In February 2016, a group of ladies presented a class on the joys and

challenges of cooking with tofu. It was such a success that a new class at PAC was formed... The Wooden Spoon Cooking Classes. Thanks to many volunteers, the financial support of the church, and the Health Ministries committee, by the end of November over 300 people had come to 14 additional classes for church members and the

community. Asian dishes, holiday meals, vegan cheese making, breakfast ideas (with children helping with the demos)

were just a few classes offered...and ALL PLANT BASED!

We are gearing up for another good year. Most classes are offered on a Thursday evening in the Fellowship Center. We are also expanding our classes to "in-home" cooking experiences for interested students in grades 5-8 on Sunday afternoons.

Even though this ministry is something I believe in, I sometimes wondered if the classes were making any difference in the lives of people. Anyone who is involved with any type of church ministry realizes that in addition to finding volunteers to run

the programs, there is never a lack of planning and work involved. So I again asked myself: "Is it worth it?" The answer is a resounding *YES!*

Last week I met a lady from the community who attended our classes. She was shopping in the bulk food section of WinCo and was happy to know that she could get almond flour to make almond milk for a cheese recipe. She was also filling her shopping cart with an abundance of whole foods. I was energized, just as I am each time we

have a class and hear words of appreciation for the effort being made and having many people say, "I didn't know that vegan

food could taste that good!" When I spoke with another participant, she told me her entire Thanksgiving meal was plant-based (except the rolls from Raley's), and that she had used some of the recipes from our *Save A Turkey* cooking class. When a 4th grader who has come to classes with his mother is excited about the upcoming children's cooking classes, that definitely makes all the work and planning worth it!
